**Course Grade:** There will be 800 total points in this course. Points will be awarded as follows

Four hour-exams	400 points
Final exam	200 points
Quizzes	100 points
Gateways	75 points
Class Participation	25 points

**Hour-exams:** There will be four hour-exams given in class throughout the semester. The tentative dates for the exams are listed on the class syllabus.

**Final exam:** The final exam is Monday 15 December, 6 - 8 pm. The final exam is cumulative.

**Quizzes:** There will be a quiz the Friday of every week that we don't have an exam. There is also the possibility of a quiz on Friday if we have an exam on Monday. Quizzes will be homework questions taken directly from the previous week's assignment. Every Thursday at the beginning of class I will answer any questions on the previous week's homework. Quizzes will be graded out of 10 points with the ten highest scores making up the 100 points. There will be no makeup quizzes. If you miss a quiz this will be one of your dropped scores.

**Gateways:** There will be two Gateway exams during the semester. The first will review differentiation from 106/107. The second will review integration from 106/107. These skills are essential to success in 208. The dates/details of the Gateway are not set yet but will be by the end of the first week.

**Participation:** These points are for participation and attendance. If you attend class every day, make an effort to speak up once in awhile and basically are a good citizen in the class community you will receive all 25 points.

**Calculators:** Any calculator is allowed on all hour in-class exams and the final. The use of calculators on quizzes will be determined week to week.

**Office Hours:** My office hours will be Monday 9:30 - 10:30 AM, Tuesday 11:00 - 12:00 PM and Wednesday 1:30 - 2:30 PM.
